Bloomberg, into its Hall of Fame at a gala dinner earlier this month in New York City. Mr. Bloomberg becomes the 46th member of the Hall, which is celebrating its 20th Anniversary this year.

Previous honorees included industry leaders (Black Rock CEO Laurence Fink, The Vanguard Group founder John Bogle), legendary investors (Mohamed El-Erian, Daniel Fuss), esteemed analysts (Henry Kaufman, Margaret Cannella), prominent academics (Edward Altman, Fischer Black) and two Nobel laureates (Robert Merton, Harry Markowitz), among others. Martin Leibowitz, the author

of <u>Inside The Yield Book</u>, longtime senior market participant and former colleague of Mr. Bloomberg, was the first inductee.

"Most of us are so busy using the Bloomberg that we don't stop and realize how much Mike Bloomberg and his incredible machine helps us everyday in our work," noted Mr. Leibowitz. "It is a tremendous privilege to be in the same Hall with my friend and exceptional colleague, Mike Bloomberg."
